

Paul-André Gauthier, CNS in Palliative Care.

Inf./RN, CNS; B.Sc.N., TCC, DMD, MN, PhD (nursing).

He is retired as a nursing professor, position that he held for more than 30 years in Northern Ontario. He completed in 1990 a Master's diploma in palliative care and, in 1991, a Master in Nursing. In 2003, he received a PhD in nursing from the University of Alberta. He is the first man who graduated with a doctorate in nursing from that university. His research was a qualitative study with oncology nurses.

Dr. Gauthier was also selected by his peers on several occasions for his leadership in the political scene.

He is one of the co-founding members of the CNS Association of Canada (since January 2016).

Paul-André is President of the CNS Association of Ontario (2023-2027). He sits on the national Board of Director of the CNS Association of Canada, and sits also on the CNA Network committee and the CNA national Winnipeg conference planning committee.

He is well recognized for speaking up for CNS and for nurses in Ontario and in Canada. He is a prolific bilingual speaker.
